SECKFORD EDUCATION TRUST



Seckford Education Trust (the 'Trust') was set up to help local communities to establish and run a number of academies and free schools in Suffolk and East Anglia. The Trust was established by the Seckford Foundation which is a long established charity dedicated to the education and welfare of young people and older people in Suffolk.

In response to local community requests, the Trust opened Beccles Free School and Saxmundham Free School in 2012, and Ixworth Free School in 2014. All three schools are thriving and the number of students choosing to attend has increased steadily since opening.

Our free schools are publicly-funded state schools which are open to local students irrespective of ability or need. Our schools are designed to provide an excellent, academically-focussed education to students in Years 7-11.

The Trust has high academic, personal and social aspirations for all our students and we aim to deliver above national average progress and achievement for every student relative to their starting points and abilities.

Our intention is for our schools to offer a broad and balanced academic curriculum which is based on traditional subject areas. English, Maths, Modern Foreign Languages, Sciences and Humanities at the core of the curriculum are tried and tested as ways for students to develop their knowledge, skills and understanding. Where necessary this curriculum can be adapted to accommodate students with specific needs.

Throughout every subject there is a strong focus on literacy and numeracy.

Via this curriculum, we aim to 'provide a foundation for life' for our students by inspiring them with a love of learning and by ensuring that they have the appropriate skills and qualifications to help them move forward confidently into further education, training and their careers when they leave our schools.

Our GCSE results in Summer 2018 in all our three schools were excellent, as they were in 2017. We achieved positive Progress 8 of +0.23 in 2018 throughout the Trust with all three schools being securely positive. That means that students in all three schools have made approximately a quarter of a grade better progress than the national average in 8 GCSEs.

In 2018, 30.1% of our students achieved EBacc at Grade 4 or above which, on a prior attainment adjusted basis, makes us the top Multi Academy Trust in England (out of 85) for EBacc at Grade 4+. Progress 8 in all of our three schools was significantly better than the average for state secondary schools in Suffolk. In 2018, the Trust was ranked 6th (again out of 85 MATs) in terms of Progress 8 achieved by Disadvantaged students.

Looking forward, the Trust intends to build on the successful development of academies and free schools and fully expects that it will work with other like-minded, local communities in Suffolk and East Anglia looking to open, reopen, develop or improve their local schools. This could either be as further free schools or as academies and could be at the primary or secondary educational levels. If you feel that the Trust could help your local community to achieve what is needed for the better education of future generations, then we would be delighted to hear from you.
